Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On behalf of the Diocese I extend sincerest congratulations to the St. Dunstan's University Board of Governors on the occasion of their Golden Jubilee. On October 4, 2019 we will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at the Basilica to mark the occasion.

During the past 50 years the SDU Board of Governors has served as a charitable foundation dedicated to supporting Catholic Education and pastoral initiatives of the Diocese of Charlottetown.

Such efforts were made possible by the prudent management of funds received from the PEI Government for the land, buildings and other assets of Saint Dunstan's University at the time (1969) of the establishment of the University of Prince Edward Island.

I also extend my profound gratitude to SDU for its generous financial support of many Diocesan ministries. For the past 50 years the SDU Board of Governors has provided funds annually to support pastoral programs of the Diocese, including catechetics, liturgy, communications, youth ministry, and campus ministry. In addition the SDU Board of Governors donated a \$1 M to the Priest's Benevolent Fund to support the pensions of our retired priests. The SDU Board contributed another \$1 M to the repairs to St. Dunstan's Basilica, as well as supplemented the cost of education of seminarians studying for the priesthood. Over the same time approximately \$2.2 M have been provided for SDU student scholarships, support for professors teaching courses in the Catholic Studies Program, and more recently the establishment of the SDU Institute devoted to studies of Christianity and Culture at the University of Prince Edward Island.

Truly the SDU Board of Governors have been faithful stewards of the Diocese, providing critical financial support in the important area of Catholic education, pastoral care, and skillful protection of the Church's historical symbols and structures.

In celebration of their excellent work and service, I cordially invited you to participate in the celebration of Mass at the Basilica on Friday, October 4, 2019 at 6:00 p.m.
